

About COPD in PEI...

- Over 8,000 Islanders living with COPD (Chief Public Health Officer's Report , 2016)
- Estimated approx 2,000+ are likely moderate to severe cases
- Prevalence of COPD expected to increase as population ages
- Population of persons aged 65 years and over expected to increase by 17% over the next 5 years

What is INSPIREDTM?

Implementing a **N**ovel and **S**upportive **P**rogram of **I**ndividualized Care for Patients and Families Living with **RE**spiratory **D**isease (INSPIRED)

- Originally developed by the Nova Scotia Health Authority in Halifax Dr. Graeme Rocker and team
- CFHI spread (transfer of a best practice from one site to another) project September 2014-2015 - HPEI one of 19 teams
- CFHI scale up (expanding the reach to all who stand to benefit in a defined jurisdiction) – HPEI one of 6 teams



<u>INSPIRED 1.0 – March 31st, 2015</u>

- Started with Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Charlottetown
- Partnership with Acute Care, Chronic Disease Prevention and Management and Primary Care
- Referral from hospital to RT COPD Coordinator


<u>INSPIRED 2.0 – April 1st, 2018</u>

Established Guiding Team


- Representation from Acute Care, Chronic Disease Prevention, Home Care and Primary Care

INSPIRED Target Population

 Persons at highest risk for AECOPD resulting in repeated emergency department visits and

hospital admissions



INSPIRED 2.0 Eligibility Criteria

Confirmed or pending diagnosis of COPD (by spirometry)
MRC breathlessness scale score 4 or 5

AND at least one of the following:

- Admission to hospital with AECOPD more than once in the past year
- Admission to ICU due to AECOPD
- Frequent (3 or more) ER visits with AECOPD in the past year



INSPIREDTM Key Elements

- ✓ Post discharge telephone call within 48 hours
- ✓ Home visit within 1-2 weeks
- ✓ COPD Education and Follow up at regular intervals
- ✓ COPD Action plan
- ✓ Phone number to call during business hours
- ✓ Advanced Care planning discussion
- ✓ Referral to other services if needed



Screening for additional factors

- All participants in INSPIRED are screened for depression and anxiety
 - ► PHQ 9
 - ▶ GAD 7

Exploring caregiver screen

Education and Support

- Provide on-going education and training for all staff
- Stakeholder meeting
- Continued mentorship through RT COPD Coordinator



Since March 2018...

- 18 New Clients to home care for INSPIRED
 - Charlottetown 11
 - Summerside 5
 - Montague 1
 - ▶ Souris 1

1 patient declined after the first home visit



"One of our patients who we recently saw for intake again was followed by the INSPIRED program through home care since last participating in Pulmonary Rehab. We noticed an increase in his knowledge of his disease, as well as supports that have been put into place for him. Being able to offer this follow up at home has made a difference for him. This is a consistent trend we see among patients who followed by the INSPIRED/Home Care Program"

"Since implementing the INSPIRED Program within Home Care, I have changed my everyday practice to include respiratory education to all clients. I frequently teach pursed lip breathing and now I always review inhaler technique with ANY clients using inhalers. I have learned through the INSPIRED Program that approximately only 30% of patients use their inhalers properly. This results in ineffective (not to mention costly) disease management"

"Many patients living with COPD also suffer from significant anxiety and distress related to the feeling of not getting enough air. One of the great benefits I have witnessed as a hospitalist is the ability of the INSPIRED program, and particularly home care nursing, to alleviate much of the anxiety for patients around the transition from hospital to home. It is rewarding to be able to facilitate a successful return home to the community for patients living with severe COPD. Many patients only leave their houses to attend their medical appointments and when they have been hospitalized there is great fear about what will happen next. I am very appreciative of my homecare nursing colleagues and the support that they have been able to provide. I do feel this translates into improved patient care and certainly my patients have expressed their satisfaction with being part of the INSPIRED program"
