# Addressing privacy

- Initially, the North spoke to our local Privacy officer regarding WCPR and to get clarification about confidentiality. We also informed our local officer that Regina also had a team, so both Privacy officers could communicate so the same message was sent throughout the Saskatchewan Health Authority.
- Both Privacy officers have attended rounds (either in person or through conference call) and have developed recommendations based on each site's rounds.
- Communication between all three teams and both Privacy officers will continue
  to ensure everyone is on the same page and that work standards that are
  developed work for all parties.







### **Consistent forms**

- The Integrated North decided to standardize our forms from the beginning. I
  adapted the forms from Integrated Health to suit our needs.
- We ran some PDSA cycles to gain feedback amongst the team and edited the forms as needed. All forms remain in Draft Version.
- Regina developed their own forms adapted from Interior Health (which is rework – earlier collaboration could have prevented this).
- Our plan is to overlay all of our forms and standardize them across all sites, so
  we are all using these forms. We hope in doing so, when our future goal to
  expand WCPR provincially goes live, the forms will be standardized for the
  entire province.
- We will start the standardization portion on December 10<sup>th</sup> through Webex format.
